## BELFORD'S NEW EXTENSION OPENED



Mr. Brendan Howlin, T.D. Wexford, leas-ceann comhairle of Dail Eireann performed the official opening of a new state of the art extension to Belford House Wexford built to expand the capacity of the house and add much needed additional living facilities for the residents. The opening was on Sunday 5th October.

The new 1400 square feet extension, is the first in a series of phased developments planned by Ard Aoibhinn Services scheduled to take place over the next three to five years, including extension to existing day care facility, opening of respite for children, and erection of 2 purpose built homes for 12 people with disabilities.

Funding for the new building came from the HSE and from funding raised through the voluntary efforts of people throughout County Wexford. The extension was built by OCM construction, managed by Paul Dempsey and designed by Shay Howell.

Mr Gerard Heaney Chief executive of Ard Aoibhinn said that the new facility represents an imaginative move that further supports the social model of care for people with a disability.

He thanked the disability section of the HSE and the Wexford

General Manager for their support and he thanked especially the people who contributed voluntarily to the development. Without their support, this facility would not have been built. Thanks was also extended to the residents and the staff of Belford House and the residential manager Geraldine Roche, for their commitment and co-operation during the building project.

Looking to the future, Mr.
Heaney said that Ard Aoibhinn hoped to
further develop their services to provide
an even greater quality of life and support not alone for people with a disability
but also for their family members.

Geraldine Roche also wished to thank her staff and all the residents who worked so hard to make the opening of the new extension a great day.


